Reconnecting the Circle essay contest awards \$25,000.00 to high school students

Reconnecting the Circle, a Virginia organization whose mission is to encourage people to learn about contemporary Native American people and cultures, and to develop a more positive, meaningful, and complete perspective on Indian Country, held an essay contest this year in which they asked Native and non-Native students to address the question, *Why is reconnecting the circle with Native Americans important today?* The 10 winners were selected from submissions they received from high school students in all 50 states and were each awarded \$2,500.00. NABA members **BiStar Corporation** and **Dakkota Integrated Systems, LLC** each contributed to the awards fund, and NABA National Executive Director Jackie Gant was one of the judges of the essay contest.
